WHAT DOES THAT SOUND MEAN?

Make sure you and your family learn the sounds of your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors by knowing the difference between a beep and a chirp!



SMOKE DETECTORS

- 3 loud beeps means smoke or fire- get out and call 9-1-1
- A single "chirp" in intervals means the battery is low.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years- if it continues to chirp with a new battery, replace the unit.



CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS



- 4 loud beeps means carbon monoxide is present- go outside and call 9-1-1
- A single "chirp" in intervals means the battery is low. If it continues to chirp with a new battery, replace the unit.
- CO alarms also have an "end of life" sound that varies by manufacturer.
